


Antique Decanters

Each holiday season since 1993, we have offered a range of antique wine decanters, primarily from England and Ireland, and from the 18th through 20th centuries. As a direct result of this tradition, beautiful and rare decanters now grace the tables of many of our customers and their friends, enhancing their enjoyment of fine food and wine.

As always, each decanter is an original antique, representing one of the classic styles of this period. Each is accompanied by a letter of authentication signed by Andrew Burne, one of England's foremost experts on early English and Irish glass.

18th Century

The Georgian Period of the late 18th century represented the height of refined elegance in British and Irish craftsmanship. Normally, we're lucky to acquire 8 to 10 18th-century decanters for our annual offer. This year is a feast of riches, with an unprecedented 17 decanters made between 1770 and 1800. Each of them has survived over 200 years, their uncompromising beauty and delicacy belying their incredible durability. No. 406 \$895 George III Decanter, lozenge stopper, rare 4 bladed neck rings, club body, flutes at shoulder and base. Irish, Belfast c. 1780.







No. 403 \$925 George III Decanter, faceted disc stopper, club body, faceted neck, basal flutes. English c. 1770.

No. 405 \$1150 George III Decanter, scalloped lozenge stopper, taper body, faceted neck, engraved tulip swags, basal flutes. English c. 1770.

No. 407 \$695 George III Decanter, target stopper, 3 bladed neck rings, plain club body. Irish, Belfast c. 1790. No. 408 \$695 George III Decanter, lozenge stopper, 3 bladed neck rings, plain club body. Irish, Belfast c. 1790.








No. 444 \$895 George III Decanter, notched lozenge stopper, taper body, flutes at neck and base. English c. 1770.

No. 445 \$895 George III Decanter, lozenge stopper, shouldered taper, flutes at neck and base. English c. 1780 No. 446 \$1,050 George III Decanter, scalloped disc stopper, taper body, faceted neck basal flutes, engraved egg and star band also with cut stars. English c. 1770. No. 443 \$975 George III Decanter, lozenge stopper, tapered club body, 3 neck rings with flutes between, flutes continue to shoulder and reappear at base. English c. 1780.









No. 441 \$1,150 George III Decanter, heart lozenge stopper, taper body, flutes at neck and base, tulip engraved bands between neck and base. English c. 1780. No. 413 \$1,250 Rare George III **Magnum** Decanter, ball stemmed mushroom stopper, 3 neck rings, flutes at shoulder and base. English/Irish c. 1800.



No. 447 \$675 George III Decanter, ball stemmed moulded mushroom stopper, 3 neck rings, club body, flutes at shoulder and base. English/Irish c. 1800.









No. 409 \$695 George III Decanter, mushroom stopper, 3 neck rings, club body, flutes at shoulder and base. English c. 1800.

No. 410 \$695 George III Decanter, ball stem moulded mushroom stopper, 3 neck rings, plain club body. English/Irish c. 1800. No. 411 \$675 George III Decanter, moulded mushroom stopper, 3 neck rings, club body, flutes at shoulder and base. English/Irish c. 1800.

No. 412 \$695 George III Decanter, target stopper,3 neck rings, flutes at shoulder and base, windows between shoulder and base. English c. 1800.

19th Century

Decanters became more diverse in design, and frequently more fanciful, in the 19th century, particularly in the later Victorian period. But they never lost their grace. Twenty-three decanters in this offer were made between 1810 and 1900.

Pair Victorian Decanters, lozenge stoppers, mallet bodies, flutes at shoulder and base, late 18th-century style. English c. 1890.








No. 440 \$695 Regency Decanter, mushroom stopper, 3 neck rings, club body, flutes, band of diamonds and vertical prisms. English c. 1810. No. 414 \$595 William IV Decanter, hollow mushroom stopper, sectional terraced neck to shoulder, cylinder body, vertical fluted pillars. Anglo-Irish, Waterford pattern, c. 1830.

No. 435 \$895 Pair William IV Decanters, hollow cushion stoppers, flutes above and below basal neck rings, heavy fluted pillars. Irish, Waterford pattern, c. 1830.



No. 417 \$495 William IV Claret Jug, hollow cushion stopper, long spout and fluted neck, handle to cylinder body, fluted pillars. English/Irish c. 1830.







No. 421 \$675 Regency Decanter, mushroom stopper, 3 neck rings, flutes above and below fan arches. English/Irish c. 1815.

No. 422 \$640 Regency Decanter, mushroom stopper, step prism neck, flutes above diamond band, radial prism base. English c. 1810.

No. 423 \$685 George IV Decanter, mushroom stopper, 3 triple neck rings, barrel body, flutes above and below diamond and strawberry diamond bands. Irish, Waterford/Cork c. 1820.



No. 433 \$595 Charles X Decanter, mushroom stopper, 3 neck rings, club body with flutes above and below large diamond field, star base. French c. 1820.



No. 438 \$650 George IV Decanter, hollow ball stopper, prism steps and flutes at neck, club body with strawberry diamonds and vertical prisms. English/Irish c. 1820.



No. 439 \$675 Louis-Phillipe Magnum Decanter, mushroom stopper, 1 basal neck ring, plain shouldered club body. Soda glass. French c. 1850.




No. 415 \$495 Victorian Decanter, pinnacle stopper, tall faceted neck, spreading club body, all hobnail cut. English c. 1850.



No. 418 \$595 Pair Victorian Decanters, hollow ball stoppers with some cloudiness, tall faceted necks, ball bodies, engraved roses between hobnails. English c. 1850.






No. 427 \$495 Victorian Claret Jug, facet ball stopper, bun body all engraved floral sprays. English c. 1870.

No. 428 \$595 Victorian Claret Jug, hollow ball stopper, bun body engraved CLARET and fruiting vine. English c. 1860. No. 429 \$495 Victorian Decanter, facet ball stopper, ruby flashed bun body cut through with fan cut star. English c. 1870. No. 430 \$475 Victorian Claret Jug, facet ball stopper, red flashed round body, cut flutes at neck. English c. 1870.







No. 426 \$575 Victorian Claret Jug, hollow ball stopper, bun body all engraved fruiting vine. English c. 1860.

No. 420 \$775 Pair Victorian Decanters, hollow pinnacle stoppers, tall faceted necks, club bodies, engraved fruiting band, facets below, footed bases. English c. 1850.

No. 425 \$225 Victorian Decanter, facet ball stopper, tall fluted neck, ball body with star cut hobnail row between bands of etching. English c. 1870.



No. 437 \$725 Pair Victorian Decanters, hollow ball stoppers, tall fluted necks, ball bodies engraved floral panels. English c. 1870.





No. 416 \$485 Victorian Decanter, pinnacle stopper, tall, slender conical body sectionally facet cut, polished swags near base. English c. 1870.

No. 424 \$245 Victorian Decanter, hollow ball stopper, 3 rings on tall neck, ball body with moulded simple panels. English c. 1860.

20th Century

Twentieth-century glassmakers crafted fine decanters that were either typical of their period or replicas of earlier styles. This year's 20th-century selections are both an hommage to the classic and rare ship's decanter. No. 431 \$595 Edwardian Ship's Decanter, lozenge stopper, 3 plain neck rings, swept plain conical body, c. 18th style. English c. 1910.

No. 432 \$695 Edwardian **Magnum** Ship's Decanter, mushroom stopper, 4 plain neck rings, tall plain conical body, 18thcentury style. English c. 1910.
